GHS implementation Status

- 1. Botswana made comments to the GHS (SANS 10234 Globally Harmonized System of Classification and Labeling of Chemicals) and hosted a meeting in November 2010 that came up with some resolutions.
- 2. In the process of Ratifying the ILO Convention 170 on Chemical Safety
- 3. Reviewing the Factories Act to increase its scope in order to incorporate all Occupational Health and Safety standards including GHS Harmonized Text

GHS implementation Status cont...

- 4. Developing Transport of Dangerous Goods Regulations in line with UN Regulations
- 5. Botswana is a signatory of the Basil Convention on the Trans-boundary Movement of Hazardous Waste
- 6. Botswana is a signatory to the Stockholm Convention on Persistent Organic Pollutants

Conclusion

- Botswana looks forward to the finalisation of the SADC GHS Harmonized Text and will work together with the region in implementing it at National Level
- Botswana looks forward to coming up with regulations that will reference SADC GHS Harmonized Text
