<u>Introduction</u>

- 1.0 Some of the key SADCTRLC objectives include the use of consultation, participation and exchange of information processes when technical regulations are developed, amended and implemented through the relevant risk and impact assessments.
- 2.0 The first project undertaken by the SADCTRLC, the SADC GHS project, will be ready for the consultative process in member states after a presentation and adoption of the draft policy by the AGM.





Resolution 1/2011

Only six (6) member states submitted written reports before the AGM. The EXCO encourages other members to submit reports in time so that they can be compiled for circulation to all at the AGM.

Member states are also encouraged to include the status reports in their country reports.





Update on 2011/12 Resolutions

Resolution 2/2011

The SADC Secretariat has made some enquiries and follow up on the issue for SADCTRLC seeking observer status on the SADC transport harmonization process. The matter is still work in progress.





Resolution 3/2011

The development of guidelines is still to be done for;

- 1. the identification of needs for harmonization of TRs
- 2. proposals for SADCTRLC harmonized TRs
- 3. determining priorities for the harmonization of TRs
- 4. consultation on Risk & Impact Assessments





Resolution 4/2011

Only four countries submitted country reports for before the AGM. A big thanks to Botswana, Zambia, South Africa and Zimbabwe for submitting reports on time.





Resolution 5/2011

The SADC Secretariat confirmed that the legal opinion confirmed that the SADC TBT Annex is indeed aligned to the WTO TBT agreement. Furthermore, it was found that the TBT Annex actually goes beyond the WTO agreement.





The SADC GHS PROJECT

The SADC GHS project was identified by the SADCTRLC to be the first project for Technical Regulations harmonization. Significant progress has been made which has resulted in the work being finalised by the consultant. A progress report on the draft policy will be presented by the consultant later on.

Mr H. Dhlamini retired from the government of Swaziland in 2011. Swaziland was requested to nominate a replacement to the EXCO. This was still be confirmed through SADC Secretariat.





Mr C. Celestine (Vice Chair) from Seychelles resigned from the government of Seychelles and a replacement is still to join the SADCTRLC family.





Funding mechanisms for TRLC projects was mainly through PTB, the DTI and SADC Secretariat. More resources were required to be able to fulfil all the plans..
